ACADEMICS (IX - XII)

OVERALL PERFORMANCE OF ICSE AND ISC: Students have once again exhibited an exceptional academic performance. The school's commitment to academic excellence has been showcased in the afore mentioned table. Three students have secured the top three ranks in Indian School Certificate Examinations (ISC) Class XII Examinations. Advika Amit Tuteja scored 99% in Humanities, Kanan Meena secured 95% in the Science Stream while Vrinda Biyani secured 96% in the Commerce stream. The average percentage of the ISC Batch was 86%.

In ICSE class X Examination, six students have secured the top three ranks. The First position was secured by Pahel Agarwal, Amber.K. Gill and Kashish Agarwal with 97%, the second position was secured by Shubhi Gattani with 97% and the third position was secured by Kanak Chandak and Manasvi Khamesra with 96%. The average percentage of the ICSE Batch was 89%.

The Cambridge Curriculum Program continues to play a pivotal role in providing our students with world-class education. Our staff has effectively implemented the Cambridge curriculum with innovative teaching methods, fostering a student-centred learning environment. CAIE staff has participated in Extension training and Marking scheme workshops in both online and offline modes. The IGCSE Curriculum offers 19 subjects. We have introduced two modern foreign languages, namely French and German this year as an optional subject for Hindi. The academic staff has been a part of various enriching sessions that were conducted by experts. This has positively impacted the teaching quality and student outcomes. The first batch of IGCSE class X students will be appearing for CAIE Examination in March 2024.

ACADEMICS (IV - VIII)

An Interdisciplinary learning project was undertaken for the students of Class VI, collaborating English, Science, Mathematics, History, and Geography with Museum Studies. Interesting lessons were planned on the topic 'Rocks and Minerals'. Students visited the Museum at Mayo College to learn about concepts through artifacts.

ASSET (Assessment of Scholastic Skills through educational testing) was conducted for all students of Classes IV to VIII in English, Science, and Mathematics, on the 23rd, 24th, and 25th of August 2023. 79 students from MCGS achieved remarkable success in ASSET 2023, securing 85 percentile and above, among all test takers. This achievement is truly commendable, especially considering that more than 2, 80, 000 students across the country participated in the ASSET assessment.

Among the 2, 80, 000 students who appeared for ASSET, the following students secured 99 percentile at the National level. They have qualified for ASSET Talent Search:

- 1. Omaya Ahuja , a student of Class IV, secured 99 percentile in English
- 2. Myra Chhabra, a student of Class VII, secured 99 percentile in English
- 3. Durriya Gupta, a student of Class VII, secured 99 percentile in Science and Mathematics
- 4. Vedika Shrivastava, a student of Class VII, secured 99 percentile in Science

Students of Classes VII and VIII participated in an Interschool French Competition organized at Sanskriti School, Ajmer. Aaryana Pandey won the 2nd prize in French Poetry; Siyona Rae secured the 1st prize in French Solo Song, and Sahnavi Handique, Devyana Jain, Mishika Jain, and Adya Baid bagged the 1st prize in French Group Song. Niah Dave, Aanya Agarwal, Avyanna Agarwal, and Shanvi Agarwal bagged the 1st prize in Poster and Chart Making. Mayo College Girls' School was the overall winner.

Eight girls participated in the first-ever IPSC French Fest 2023 held on the 17th and 18th of July, 2023 at Daly College, Indore. Anaysa Mittal, a student of Class VII, won the Outstanding Performance award in French poetry.

Teachers teaching Class VI attended a session on Museology at Mayo College on Friday, the 14th of July, 2023. The session was conducted by Mr. Digvijay Singh for the teachers of Mayoor School and Mayo College Girls' School. It gave an insight into the complexities of Museum Studies.

Professional development seminars were conducted for the teachers of Mayo College, Mayo College Girls' School, and Mayoor School teaching English, Science, Mathematics, and Social Studies in classes IV to VI. This was done under the 'One Mayo concept'. The seminar for English teachers was conducted at Mayoor School. For Science and Mathematics, seminars were held at MCGS. The Humanities seminar was conducted at Mayo College. The same was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Sarvesh Naidu, an eminent educationist, and member of the Education committee

MCGC Schools. The objective was to share the International Approach of teaching and Best Practices.

The German teacher, Ms. Prachi Pandey attended a conference on 'Soft skills and competencies for work', organized by the Indo-German Teachers' Association and Goethe Institute, in Delhi.

To celebrate the diversity of languages, Sanskrit Shloka Vachan and French Poetry Recitation competitions became a part of the IPSC Literary Fest. The Sanskrit Shloka Vachan event centered around the interpretation of the Sholas from the Bhagavad Geeta. Outstanding performance awards went to Yenedi Keerthi and G Naga Chinmayee from Kittur Rani Channamma Residential Sainik School for Girls, Kittur, and Aayavardhan Agrawal and Satvik Talreja from Mayo College, Ajmer. In the French Poetry Recitation event known as, "La recitation de poesie", Ishita Kothari and Kanika Vasu from The Emerald Heights International School, Indore, were recognized as the Best Delegation school for their excellence in French Poetry Recitation. Two students from Mayo College Girls' School, Tuhina Singh, and Khiwama Rai, received awards for outstanding performance.

172 students from Classes IV to VIII appeared for the first stage of the International Hindi Olympiad. The results are awaited.

A French workshop was organized for the students of classes VI to IX on the 29th and 30th of September, 2023. The theme was French culture and Cuisine and it was conducted by Ms. Eline Cailaud, a French professor at Rajasthan University. Girls discussed French

Cuisine and also played games that focused on it. Students picked up the language using this playway method. It was an interactive and enriching experience.

Ms. Pinky Vaishnav, a Geography teacher, and Ms. Ritu Beri, who teaches Science, conducted an interdisciplinary concept-based activity for the students of Class VII. The students made a working model of the weather station.

Students of Class VI were taken on an educational visit to Khejpura to familiarise them with the concepts of formation, physiography, and vegetation of the Aravalli mountain range. They majorly enjoyed the experience of learning

The school focuses on rigorous professional standards and student achievements. In Cambridge Lower Secondary, sixteen teachers have completed introductory training and Four teachers have done extension training in various subjects. In this academic year, the class strength for class VI Cambridge Lower Secondary is tweenty five and Class VII is thirty five.

Like poets crafting verses, our mathematical explorations have not only sought answers but have also unveiled the beauty and elegance that is inherent in logical ideas.

Class 8 students were part of an engaging session on "Verbal and Nonverbal Reasoning," led by two accomplished students of Class X, Nandini Jagwain and Drishti Todi. This interactive session not only clarified intricate concepts but also instilled a sense of reasoning and confidence in approaching mathematical challenges. In July, six girls of grade 11 participated in the virtual Mathematics Symposium, 'Mathelogics' organized by Neerja Modi School, Jaipur. The participants presented research papers on various topics.

PRAKRITI - The Environment Club at Mayo College Girls' School, offers a platform to the students of grades IX to XII to fulfil their commitment towards bettering our environment. Its members are encouraged to engage in various enriching activities and discussions regarding environmental issues faced by mankind in present times or those that might cause concern if current actions continue. These issues include climate change, overpopulation, pollution and inefficiency in following the SDGs. The club's main aim has always been to instill a sense of sensitivity and empathy in students and motivate them to take cohesive, collaborative, and effective steps towards environment conservation, and protection, and addressing issues of global importance in ways that are creative and interactive.

PRAKRITI conducted an activity where in students were made to understand the significance of the pH level of water, and how a change in the required composition can have drastic effects on humans and the environment. Girls tested the pH level of different water samples using pH strips. This gave an insight into how anthropogenic activities can affect not only aquatic organisms but also the terrestrial ecosystem.

Students watched a presentation on climate change and its disastrous impact on all abiotic and biotic organisms and how it causes natural disasters. They watched a presentation on the flora of

the school campus. This sensitized and educated the club members about their surroundings. There after a practical activity was organized wherein the students had to go around the campus to collect the flowers and leaves they had learned about. It was an interactive activity that helped understand why one needs to conserve the environment.

The club also organized a logo-designing activity where its members were expected to think out of the box and unleash their creativity to produce a logo that, as per them, defined the club 'PRAKRITI'. One wanted to see what the club meant to its members and what magic can be created when their imagination is put on paper.

There are a variety of birds present on the campus. Bird feeders were placed for them at various points. These bird feeders were made out of ice cream sticks and clay.

The Environment Club introduced a student group - "Green Brigade" - who were given the responsibility of energy conservation. The members were assigned different spaces in the school building. They were required to make sure that no lights or fans were switched on unnecessarily.

The "Mayocology" is an upcycling project which was an initiative of students. The students of the club collaborated to upcycle pens, using paper to make the body and cap of the pen. Faded white singlets were also Upcycled by reprinting leaves and other patterns.

The Environment Club conducted a two-day TERI workshop on the 21st and 22nd of August, 2023 for the students of Environmental Science, Environmental Applications, and Environment Management. The resource persons for the workshop were Dr. Livleen K Kahlon, Ms. Taru Mehta, and Dr. Avantika Singh who gave valuable insights on topics like Leadership and Sustainability. They also discussed about 'Rajasthan from the lens of climate change'. This workshop helped our students to discover the unknown leader in them and understand if 'Just Transition' can be a solution for our future. They enlightened us with various environmental terminologies and concepts such as Carbon Footprint and Sustainable development.

Days of public importance such as World Environment Day and Ozone Day are celebrated by the Environmental Club Activities such as essays and poem writers article writing, poster making, and presentations are organized


ART WORKSHOPS:-

CAREER COUNSELING

On these lines, we let our students imagine and dream and open up the possibilities that are there for them to explore. The Career Counselling cell has expanded with new team members joining in to cater to the ever increasing prospects that can be made available for students.

Throughout the year, we had workshops, psychometric testing, individual counselling sessions, and visits by different university representatives to assist students in exploring the plethora of opportunities available for them and to be able to pick the one that best suits their ability, aptitude, personality and interest.

Mayo College Girls' School co-hosted the Higher Education Awareness Programme along with Mayo College. The programme, held in September, was spread over two days. It consisted of 18 workshops on different topics, a profile building fair, panel discussion and the Career Fair. This witnessed a participation from more than $140\,\mathrm{universities}$ from $15\,\mathrm{countries}$.

From the batch of 2022-23, 66% of our students have taken admission in Indian Colleges and 44% students have gone to different colleges in countries like USA, UK, Europe, Canada, Singapore and Australia.

Ms. Shradha Chauhan, the in-house Career Counsellor, went on a tour to the United States where she visited 15 universities within a span of 2 weeks. INTERNATIONALISM

Internationalism is a key aspect of the educational approach at school. Exposure to different cultures and backgrounds broaden students' horizons and help them develop a global perspective. Despite the challenges post-pandemic, the school was able to provide students with opportunities for virtual and offline exchanges.

Participating in these exchanges helps students learn about different cultures and develop essential skills such as communication, collaboration, and empathy.

AFS is an international, voluntary, non-governmental, non-profit organization that provides intercultural learning opportunities to help people develop the knowledge, skills, and understanding needed to create a more just and peaceful world. AFS events that the school conducted and participated in this year are as follows:

1. Assam Domestic Virtual Exchange - The school had an exchange program with Royal Global School, Assam in May 2022. 35 girls of Class VIII of MCGS along with the girls of RGS participated in the same. The exchange was spread over 5 days between the 13th of May 2022 and the 28th of May 2022. In this program, we exchanged information about language, literature, ethnic wear, climate, flora & and fauna, folk culture, architecture, mythology, arts & and crafts, cuisine, music, resources & and tourist attractions of the two states. Such exchanges teach us to be tolerant, inclusive, and open to new ideas & and cultures.

2. National Meet, Varanasi

Two girls, Mansha Narang and Surabhi Aivalli of grade XI attended a national meet in Varanasi on AFS as a concept.

Girls won an award for the most active participation.

3. AFS west zone meet

Manaswini Mertiya and Priyal Kapoor of grade IX participated in the AFS West Zone meet. The interactive workshops held at the meet gave the children a clear idea about design thinking, leadership skills, and innovation.

4. AFS regional activity

Students participated in the AFS regional activity conducted for the west zone. Aastha Rai, Mahi Bishnoi, Navkeerat Kaur, Ameera Sachdeva, Nandini Agrawal, and Shanaya Jain of grade X secured the first position in this category.

By virtue of being a member school, GCC Educator 2023 - Collaborative Project AFS USA & AFS India are conducted to offer a platform to maximise exposure on a global level.

Students and teachers are given an equal opportunity to be a part of various short-term courses, educator programs, and community service programs, where competitions are based on global issues.

The World Scholar's Cup, abbreviated as WSC, is an international event held every year with more than 15,000 students from more than 65 countries participating in this global academic program. The World Scholar's Cup intends to equip students with knowledge and skills that are not extensively covered in schools, and can often be dubbed as unconventional, but interesting. The school has been a proud host of the World Scholar's Cup since 2019, and a regular participant of the event since 2017. This year, the Regional Round was hosted on the 8th and 9th of August, 2022. The WSC international organizing team, including Mr. Robert Brown and Mr. Arsh Srivastav, along with Mr Vishal Verma and Mr Dexter

Shane Noakeswho made the Regional Round even more invigorating than before. A total of seven schools participated from Rajasthan and Punjab, with a few independent delegations. The theme of the year 2022 'A World Re-Renewed' allowed the students to explore it within the spheres of History, Social Studies, Science and Technology, Art and Music, and Literature and Media. In this two day event, students from both Ajmer and nearby schools participated, with refreshing enthusiasm. The challenges held on the first day were the Team Debate, Collaborative Writing, and the Scholar's Challenge. The Scholar's Bowl was the focus of the second day, during which the students collaborated to find out answers, using their knowledge and skills. The next was the Debate Showcase in which the top-scoring debaters from the Team Debate event participated and formed teams amongst themselves. The last event for the day was the Scholar's Showcase in which the scholars displayed a side of them, otherwise unknown to the audience.

The outstanding results of the Regional Round of WSC were as follows; Kaashvi Choukhany secured the first position in Writing Champions, with Sangkenma Rai coming in as second and Palak Vohra as third. Navkirat Kaur, Pari Jain, and Kaavya Bansal secured the first position in Team Writing, with Radhika Tiberwal, Adira Singh, and Prisha Nahar bagging the 3rd position. Aditi Khubchandani, Jayanandini Sodha, and Divyangana Sinh bagged

the third position in Team Debate with Jayanandini securing the third position in Debate Champions as well. Palak Vohra also secured the first position in Debate Champions. Sangkenma Rai, Riya Maheshwari and Nitya Mantri won the first position in Team Challenge, with Kashvi Kejriwal, Devaanshi Singhal and Prisha Singhal coming in as third. Paridhi Birla, Anandi Gupta, and Ananya Beriwal secured the first position in Team Bowl, with Radhika Tiberwal, Adira Singh, Prisha Nahar coming close with the second position, and Aanya Mittal, Tanushree Gattani, and Aanya Kalani as third. Paridhi Birla, Anandi Gupta, and Ananya Beriwal won the first position in the Champions Team along with Radhika Tiberwal, Adira Singh, and Prisha Nahar coming in the second position. Aarna Agarwal and Palak Vohra won School's Top Scholar, along with Palak Vohra, Keya Choudhary, and Jayanandini Sodha, bagging the first, second, and third positions respectively in the Champion Scholar Category. Raina Gupta won the Da Vinci Award.

In February 2023, the school welcomed a delegation from Schloss Gaienhofen, Germany. During this visit, students from both schools engaged in enriching discussions, exchanged ideas, and deepened their cultural awareness. By living and learning together, they not only fostered intercultural understanding but also forged long-lasting friendships.
